I remembered that Anthony had done roofing many years ago. I sent Joey



Trucksess a text and asked if he could give me a call, which he did. I told him about Anthony and his struggle to find a job. Joey said he would give him an interview which he did and then he hired him! You can see the truck that they've entrusted to Anthony for his role with the company. But in many ways that is not the most important part. Before Anthony graduated, we filed a FAFSA and got him signed up at Saddleback College in Alcohol and Drug Studies. His heart's desire is to work with youth and help them before they get caught up in gangs. His second class, which he had to pass in order to be accepted in the program, required an extensive paper regarding why he was choosing his areas of specialty, what he would need to do to be succesful, a summary page and references. He worked on it for three weeks. On the night before he was to turn it in, he lost it on his Chromebook. The next day he went to his teacher to explain what happened. She encouraged him to check a few places on campus for help. He found someone in the library that found it in the "trash" and helped him get it out and then he emailed to his teacher. She called him in personally and gave him back his graded assignment. With tears in his eyes, he said "I got 100%" I had tears in my eyes by then, too!

He is a full time Merchandiser Lead for the Frito Lay Corporation. That means that he not only has his own route that he stocks, but he also is now training and supervising other employees on their routes.
